



### THE WONG FAMILY

The New York Wong Family Benevolent Association originated in the late 1800. At first it was organized as "Wong Kong Har Tong (黃江夏堂)", headquartered in the second floor of 4 Mott Street. "Wong Kong Har Tong" moved to its current 24 Bowery location under rental agreement in 1922 due to growth in membership and activity. In 1942 delegates attending the First Wong Association National Convention in San Francisco approved to merge with "Wong Yun Shan Gong Suo (黃雲山公所)", another Wong organization established in the early 1900, to become the "Wong Kong Har Yun Shan Gong Suo (黃江夏雲山公所)". Finally in 1967 the Ninth Wong Association National Convention held in Chicago renamed "Wong Kong Har Yun Shan Gong Suo" as "Wong Family Benevolent Association (黃氏宗親會)".

Between 1960 and 1964 members of "Wong Kong Har Yun Shan Gong Suo (黄雲山公所)" made generous donations to enable the purchase of the current 24 Bowery building instead of leasing, made major renovations and celebrated its grand opening during the Eighth Wong Association National Convention hosted by New York. The event coincided with the 1964 New York World's Fair.

The mission of the Wong Family Benevolent Association is to provide a permanent and suitable environment for members to fraternize, preserve cultural activities, give mutual support, and charitable work. For the last century the Association has played a pivotal role in the life of New York's Chinese community, especially for those Chinese-American with the sure name of Wong or Huang. Current activities included but not limited to —

- Support the Chinese Community Benevolent Association (CCBA) as an elected Standing Member of the Executive Committee.
   Involved with various community work such as the support of the creation and activities of the Chinatown Partnership Local Development Cooperation (CPLDC) and Chinatown Business Improvement District (BID).
- Established for over 30 years, an Association Scholarships Fund to honor and recognize outstanding young students for their achievements.
- Created the "Wong Family Burial Plot Fund" with two cemetery locations in New Jersey to provide members in need of a peaceful resting place.
- Annual celebration of Lunar New Year and pay homage to our senior members with banquet and recognitions.

We would especially like to recognize the contributions of the Wong Family Association Scholarship Program. The Program celebrated 30 years In 2014 and was one of the first scholarship programs created by the many family associations in Manhattan Chinatown.

Wong Family Benevolent Association continues to support and fund charitable causes such as flood and earthquake relief in Taiwan and China, and the construction of roads and schools overseas. Our members take their responsibility as Citizens of the World seriously and will continue to be a moving force in the New York City Chinese community.

#### Fang A. Wong

Fang A. Wong was born in Canton, China and immigrated to the United States in November 1960 at the age of twelve. He attended New York City public schools and has been a naturalized citizen since January 1963. Mr. Wong volunteered for the U. S. Army in May 1969 and served 25 months in Vietnam. He retired from the Army in May 1989 as a Chief Warrant Officer (CW3). In

addition to his Vietnam service he also served tours of duty in Germany, Korea, and several stateside military bases. His military decorations among others included the Bronze Star, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (3rd Award), Republic of Vietnam Service Medal, and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal (6 Campaign Stars). Mr. Wong completed 2 degrees while serving on active duty – BS in Business Administration from New York Institute of Technology (1978) and MA in Management from Central Michigan University (1981).

Following his retirement, Mr. Wong joined The American Legion, Lt. B. R. Kimlau Chinese Memorial Post #1291 in New York City and has been a member for the past 24 years. He has held appointed and elected offices at Post, County and

District levels, serving as Post Adjutant from 1996 to 2009, New York County Commander 1995-1997. He was award an Honorary Life Membership by his Post in 2001. In 2002 Mr. Wong was elected Commander of the Department (State) of New York American Legion.

Mr. Wong served The American Legion, Department of New York as Chairman, Americanism Committee for three years. He has served as Department Commander's Aide and as member of the Department Resolutions Committee. Mr. Wong served as the Department of New York Membership Consultant for 2006-2009. He also served as a Director of the New York Empire Boys' State Program and as a member of the planning committee for the creation of the New York State American Legion College. He has been a delegate to Department Conventions every year since 1995.

On the national level, Mr. Wong has been a delegate to National Conventions since 1995. He has served on several committees/Commission and served as the Chairman, National Security Commission for 2007-2009. Mr. Wong was elected as The American Legion National Vice Commander for 2003-2004. He is a Past President of the Department Commanders Club, a life member of Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans in Canada U.S. Chapter (ANAVICUS), and a member of the Past National Vice Commanders Club. Mr. Wong was elected as The American Legion National Commander for 2011-2012.

In other activities, Mr. Wong is a member of the Advisory Committee on Veterans' Employment, Training, and Employer Outreach (ACVETEO) of the U.S. Department of Labor for 2006-2009. He served as Chairman of Special Investigation Committee for the Chinese Community Benevolent Association (NyC) and the Office of the Attorney General, State of New York in 2005. Mr. Wong was honored by the New Jersey State Assembly with a proclamation for his services and achievements with The American legion in 2003 and the U.S. Citizenship & Naturalization Service, Department of Homeland Security with the "Outstanding American By Choice Award" in 2006. In February of 2007 he was invited by the National Organization of The Jewish War Veterans to participate in their 22nd Annual Allied Veterans Mission to Israel. Mr. Wong was indicted into the New York State Senate Veterans' Hall of Fame in 2012. As a member of the New York Wong Family Benevolent Association for nearly 5 decades and active for the past 4 years, Mr. Wong served as the Association Building Executive Director for 2012-2014 and was elected as President of the Association in November 2014.

Since his retirement from the U.S. Army, Mr. Wong was employed as a Senior Operations Specialist by L-3 Communications, Command & Control Systems and Software (C2S2) Division in support of the Army Software Engineering Center (SEC) at Fort Monmouth, New Jersey from 1989-2010. He has been married to the former Barbara Lam for over 39 years and has one son, Eric.
